The Pastor's Pen

* This weekend at the **6.00pm Saturday evening Mass** we welcome some children and families from St. Joseph's School, Corinda for their **School Sponsored Mass for Term IV**. I'm sure that they'll enjoy being with us, giving themselves to our worship, as much as we'll enjoy having them participate in our most important Catholic gathering, our weekly Eucharist as a community of faith.

* **First Communion will be celebrated at all 4 weekend Masses in our community on Saturday 18th / Sunday 19th November** with those children (around 80) and families enrolled in our Parish First Communion Preparation Programme for 2017. Please keep these children and families preparing for this important celebration at the forefront of your prayers during these weeks. Don't plan to be away on this weekend. We need you with us to pray for, support and welcome these children in a special way to the Table of the Lord for the first time.

* **Procedure for the November Mass and Remembrance Envelopes.** They are the Yellow coloured envelopes available at the doors of our two Churches and at the Parish Office. Please take one, or more if required, write the deceased family/friends'/parishioners' name(s) on the rear of the envelope, place your generous donation inside the envelope and return on either collection plate.

These envelopes will be opened and the names will be recorded by me. A random selection of empty envelopes will then be placed in the basket before the altar in each of our church buildings during November, the month of prayerful remembrance of the Holy Souls. DO NOT place your envelopes into the basket before the altar. Use the collection plates at each Mass.

Speaking of matters monetary, and of remembrance, leads me to the seemingly strange Gospel for this weekend. At first reading it appears to be all about paying taxes, one of the eternal problems of human society. There's more to this little story though.....

Matthew tells us that the Pharisees had got together in a group, a cabal or clique, to plot against Jesus and try to trap Him. Why? Well, as you'll recall, He had been saying some challenging and confronting things to them, and to the Chief Priests and other elders/leaders of the people, as we've heard over the past few weekends. They'd been 'put out' no doubt, so they're seeking their revenge.

The trap went like this; The Jews resented the Roman occupation of their country. In particular, they didn't like paying taxes to Rome using Roman coinage. This was because the Roman money had the head of Caesar impressed on its surface and because Caesar Tiberius claimed, with the approval of the Roman Senate, to be a son of their pagan gods. For the Jews, as for us, there was only One True God. As far as they were concerned this God had no 'son'. Moreover, images of God weren't allowed because God was so Holy, way above and beyond any human pictures or idolatrous images. Having said this, we must understand that the Jewish leaders (Chief Priests, Pharisees and Elders of the people) were pragmatic enough to realise that they had to endure paying taxes to their Roman occupiers, lest they suffer a worse fate from the Roman Governor, Pilate as you'll recall, and the Roman army. To fail to pay taxes with this 'tainted' pagan coinage risked the destruction of the entire nation and people. Paying taxes was seen as the lesser of two evils.

When they asked Jesus if it was permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not they thought like this;

If He said No, then He was a traitor to Rome, and they could report Him to the Governor and have Him punished for inciting rebellion against Caesar and Rome. If, however, Jesus said Yes, then He would be seen as a friend of the hated Roman invaders and as a person who supported the blasphemy of a human being (Caesar Tiberius) claiming to be a god, circulating his false, idolatrous image to everyone on coins. Ha, Ha, they thought that either way they had Him!

Straight away Jesus saw this trap and their hypocrisy. He asked these same Pharisees for one of the offensive, 'tainted' Roman tax coins that they themselves had in their pockets and purses. You see, the very ones trying to trap Him had this money concealed on their person. Next, Jesus asked them whose head/image was impressed on the coin? When the Pharisees said, "Caesar's", the idolatrous false god, He told them to give back to Caesar what was his, and to God what was God's.

Caesar, the human Emperor claiming to be a son of god could have his dirty money with its insulting (to the Jews, anyway) image back. Jesus said that what mattered was that any Jew who really worshipped the One, True and Living God, give back their total allegiance to this God.


Our entire lives come from, are kept in existence by, and belong to God. It's our selves, our hearts, minds, souls and spirits, that God wants from us. If we give that back, making ourselves our offering, then we'll be at rights with God. The Pharisees knew this great commandment because it was written in the books of Exodus and Leviticus, books of the Jewish Law that they had read; "Hear Oh Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is One. You must love the Lord your God with all of your mind, heart, soul and strength. You must love your neighbour as yourself."

In our own times when more Christians are persecuted covertly and overtly than at any previous time in history, both here in Australia and overseas, the wisdom and truth Jesus showed, taught and practiced needs to sink deep into our own thinking and practice. We're to give to God what belongs to God, ourselves. The empires, caesars and kingdoms of humanity will come and go, as did Rome, but the Lord is eternal and always present with us.

What can institutions do to help us feel safe?

Children and young people said institutions should:



- RESPECT** their abilities, observations, needs and wishes
- DO** what they're supposed to do and what they say they'll do
- ASK** what they're thinking, feeling, seeing and what they need
- INFORM** kids about dangers – but also what's being done to protect them
- WATCH** what adults are doing, and how they're behaving
- STAND UP AND SPEAK OUT** when kids are being hurt, bullied or treated badly
- LISTEN** to what kids are really saying

Kids said they needed to have some power and control to feel safe, including after they had told adults about being in an unsafe situation.

Safeguarding Reflection: In order to feel safe, young people would like us to commit to the actions outlined in the illustration left.

Archbishop Mark Coleridge has publically spoken about the commitment of the Archdiocese to the Policy of Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults.

65% of our ministers have handed in Volunteer Data Forms as per the Safeguarding Policy, and as mentioned two weeks ago, only half of all volunteers have attended the Safeguarding Training.

Are we at Corinda Graceville clearly showing we listen to what kids are saying? Are we zealously doing what we're supposed to do as outlined in the Safeguarding Policy? ...

Centenary Art Work: the art work to commemorate the Centenary of the Daughters of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart in Corinda is progressing. The commissioned artist has reported that he is waiting to receive the carving of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart which is now complete, and then will assemble it with the background piece. At this stage it should be completed in the first half of November. *May the Sacred Heart of Jesus be Everywhere Loved! Forever!*

Illegal Parking at Christ the King: continues to be an issue. Please respect our neighbours and their right to enter and leave their own properties safely. A large number of parking infringements have occurred. Parking infringements, will be served upon anyone parking illegally. The following rules are a reminder of our road rules:-

- 1) **No parking across driveways.**
- 2) **No parking against the traffic flow.**
- 3) **No parking in areas which have a yellow line adjacent to the gutter.**

The Rosary: the month of October has traditionally been a month in which the Church promotes the Rosary. The Sorrowful Mysteries are prayed on Tuesday and Fridays. As the Rosary is a prayer of meditation on the life of Jesus, these mysteries obviously highlight Jesus' passion. The Sorrowful Mysteries are:

- *The Agony in the Garden* (Matt. 26:36-46),
- *The Scourging* (Matt. 27:26),
- *The Crowning with Thorns* (Matt. 27:29),
- *The Carrying of the Cross* (John 19:17),
- *The Crucifixion* (Luke 23:33-46).



Of course you can choose the scriptural pieces from the other Gospels. This is simply one suggested grouping. When you pray the Sorrowful Mysteries again, and if you use the other Gospel pieces, you will notice other aspects of these mysteries that the particular evangelist wishes to highlight in their portrayal of the person of Jesus. Worthwhile meditation here.
