The Pastor's Pen....

It good to be back with you for my second weekend after my Retreat and Annual Leave finished at the end of May. It seems that all has gone well in my absence and for this I am grateful to you, to our Parish staff and to the visiting Clergy on weekdays and weekends.

The First Reading for this Sunday Ordinary Time is about the corruption of relationships and creation caused by our human choices and by falling for the temptation to pride and arrogance. The Gospel of St. Mark is taken from early in Jesus' ministry, revealing Jesus beginning to create a new humanity and Israel, a new people and family of God.

Many misunderstood what Jesus is doing including some of his own family while a few others actively objected to and resisted his saving, renewing work. They went so far as to accuse Jesus of working for the Devil/Satan. For my money the sin against the Holy Spirit that can't be forgiven is to choose to reject God's saving, healing and merciful work in Jesus. Clearly, if someone chooses to reject God's forgiveness and the Holy Spirit working in Jesus then they can't be forgiven, having rejected the offer of God's forgiveness made in him.

This is a much more serious and grievous choice than Jesus' family being concerned for his welfare and sanity due to a misunderstanding over what he was on about. Nevertheless, doing God's work can (and sometimes does) from time to time lead us to being misunderstood about what we stand for and are about. When this happens we need to follow what St. Paul advocates in the Second Reading; place our faith and hope in the Risen Lord and keep speaking and explaining our faith and why we live, choose, value and act as we do.

The Prayer after Communion helpfully puts it this way: May your healing work, O Lord, free us, we pray, from doing evil and always lead us to what is right. Through Christ our Lord.

Forming a new Parish Pastoral Council.

Before I went on retreat and holiday I wrote to you about the future direction and progress of our Parish Community and some essential ways that we can and must develop. Key to this development and to our engagement with the challenges and opportunities of the wider Church and our society is to form and establish a new Parish Pastoral Council.

Accordingly, I am asking all of you to think and pray about your membership on this key Council. Our new Council will focus on our Parish Pastoral planning and development, on engagement with Archdiocesan planning and National Church decrees and of course on our own local needs and plans.

If you see that you can contribute as a possible Council member, please let me know personally or by contacting with the Parish Office. I'm looking for about 10 parishioners as members. You can be one of them. Please, seriously consider this help to your community!
